1. To consider items deferred from the meeting held on 18th January, 2021.

 - 1.11 Parking – New Road, Old Road

To discuss impact of additional traffic as a result of new housing developments.

3. Kirkham Gardens Community Commissioning
BBLP have advised that the request for double yellow lines at this location is sat at position 99 out of 120.
Should the Town Council wish to proceed with a Traffic Regulation Order (TRO) through the Community Commissioning scheme, the estimated cost to the Council will be in the region of £10,000

4. To note any updates on the following matters:
- **Emergency Walking & Cycling measures**
Herefordshire Council has completed a review of the Emergency Active Travel Measures and has advised that the recommendation for Bromyard is to remove the temporary footway widening measures and re-instate parking from 19th July. Planters will need to be taken away and lining adjustments required to reinstate parking bays. There is a possibility that the barrel planters may be available for other uses if so desired.
 - **Transfer of on-street parking from the North side to the south side of Cruxwell Street.**
 - **Junction New Road/High Street – *Cllr N Shaw***
 - **Frog Lane - Entrance to Petrol Station and No-Through Traffic.**
The Chairman to report back following a meeting with the new owners.
 - **Church Street/Sherford Street Zebra Crossing**
Members are advised that the proposed redesign of the junction has been passed to Balfour Beatty to progress. See attached plan. Whilst no definitive timeframe has been agreed, it is anticipated that subject to no complications, the scheme may be delivered by the end of the current financial year.
